"Mighty Uke Day is a celebration of the diminutive yet dynamic ukulele and honors its unique ties to Michigan culture, as well as its contributions to music education and appreciation in the schools and community."

Celebrating a time when style mattered and class was king, Kansas City's *Victor & Penny* feature tight harmonies, dazzling guitar work and a fiery ukulele. Part of the new wave of Hawaiian ukulele artists honoring the past while taking the instrument into new directions, *Kalei Gamiao* mesmerizes audiences with imaginative musicality and flawless execution. He embraces a wide range of jazz, rock, pop, classical, blues, flamenco, and funk styles while paying homage to his island roots. Kalei has performed around the world in Japan, Korea, Taiwan, China, Hong Kong,
